



### Sir John Forbes, MD (1787 - 1861)

The next time your physician places a cold stethoscope to your chest, you can thank Sir John Forbes (1787 – 1861). While he did not invent this device, he was “instrumental” in promoting its use throughout the English-speaking world. John Forbes was born on 17 December 1787 in Banffshire, Scotland. He was the fourth son of local tenant farmer Alexander Forbes and Cilia Wilkie. He served in the Royal Navy as a surgeon between 1807 and 1816. In 1818, Forbes acquired an early model of the newly invented stethoscope of René Laënnec. He translated into English the French physician’s work *De L’Auscultation Médiante* (1819). On 15 February 1841, Forbes was appointed court physician to Prince Albert (1819-1861) and the royal household – a post that he held until his death in 1861. [Learn more here.](#)

Not so long ago, genealogy involved personal visits to churches and libraries, hundreds of file cards and documents, and complex hand-written family trees. Today, tracing your lineage has been revolutionized by computers and the Internet. Online services have streamlined and enhanced the ability to research and create family trees. Many services can assist you in organizing your genealogical research, such as FamilySearch and MyHeritage. However, the Clan Forbes Society has chosen to use Ancestry.com for recording its many family trees. Ancestry has the most records of any other site (17 billion), is extremely easy to use, has a mobile app, and has a companion program for updating information offline. [Learn more here.](#)



### Heritage of Hogmanay

Hogmanay is a quintessentially Scottish holiday: born of pagan mysticism, enlivened with Viking bravado, challenged by religious clashes, and enriched by local traditions. Beginning in the 16th century, the Protestant Reformation effectively banned Christmas for 400 years. In fact, Christmas Day didn’t become a public holiday in Scotland until 1958. Instead, Scots celebrated the mid-winter holiday of Hogmanay with their friends and families. Today, Hogmanay is one big party in such urban centers as Edinburgh. 


## Highland Games & Festivals
