TARTAN DAY: A DAY FOR SCOTTISH-AMERICANS

Americans of Scottish descent have played a vibrant and influential role in the development of this country. However, this influence was not

officially recognized by the United States Government until 1998, when the U.S. Senate passed Resolution 155 recognizing April 6th as National Tartan Day.

Sponsored by current Senate Majority Leader Trent Lott, Resolution 155 created the holiday to recognize "the outstanding contribution of millions of Scottish-Americans to our great nation." Scots and Scottish-Americans have left their mark as pioneers and innovators in the fields of science, technology, theology, education, medicine, government, economics, architecture, literature, the media, and the visual and performing arts.

Tartan Day is the anniversary of the Declaration of Arbroath — the Scottish Declaration of Independence — signed on April 6, 1320. On that date a group of Scots asserted that they, the people, had the right to choose their own government. Their daring words, "...we fight not for glory, nor riches, nor honours, but only and alone we fight for freedom, which no good man surrenders, but with his life" inspired our own Declaration of Independence.

Tartan Day in the United States became a reality through the organizing efforts of the Scottish Coalition. The national organizations that comprise the Coalition serve the Scottish-American community principally through research, long-term planning, and as a resource for information and guidance.
